Kayak Paddle Spear

Hex Wrench





Insert paddle spear into shaft above pin-lock

Tighten the bolt clockwise with the hex wrench until it's firmly seated. Stop when it becomes difficult to turn—do not overtighten.



Insert handle shaft back into paddle shaft.

IMPORTANT

Keep Spear sheathed at all times when not in use.







INSTALLING YOUR WHOA PADDLE SPEAR

Separate paddles at the pin-lock (middle)

 Once separated you will have both a male and female shaft. The male shaft has the pin-lock mechanism

Insert the WHØA Paddle Spear into the male shaft

- Slide the spear into the hollow paddle shaft until the top of the silicone plug is fully seated and the base of the spear meets the end of the shaft.
- It should be a snug fit.

Secure the Spear

- Use the provided hex wrench to tighten the bolt clockwise until it feels secure and no longer turns easily.
- Note: Due to slight variations in paddle shaft diameters, the silicone insert may require slight adjustment.

If the spear is tight going in:

- Try twisting or gently wiggling it into place.
- Or, slightly loosen the spear (turn counterclockwise) to decompress the silicone plug, insert fully, then retighten.

If the entire spear base spins when tightening:

- This means the fit is too loose. Remove it, slightly tighten the spear outside the shaft, and reinsert.
- · Repeat as needed until the spear seats snugly and stays in place when you tighten it.

Reattach Your Paddles

Reinsert the male shaft into the female paddle shaft and engage pin-lock mechanism.

1 Important Safety Note

The WHØA Spear is very sharp. Do not remove it from the paddle shaft unless absolutely necessary. Handle with care at all times.
